We hold our student athletes and students who participate in extracurricular activities to high standards.

ALL students who wish to participate in sports or extracurricular activities must maintain good behavior from the beginning of the school year until tryouts and throughout the season.

This means your student must earn at least an 80% for behavior a majority of each PBIS period in order to try out or participate.

We do not expect our students to be perfect, and that is why they only have to earn an 80% or higher a majority of the time. We know every student can have a bad day or even a bad week.

We also have many supports to help our students maintain good behavior. Those supports include, but are not limited to:

- PBIS district wide (expectations are pre-taught, practiced frequently, and rewarded when done correctly)
- Social Emotional Learning (occurs daily, provides students with strategies and knowledge)
- Behavior Coordinator and coach to work with teachers and students
- School Deans
- School counselors
- Rtl for academics

We also expect our student athletes and students who participate in extracurricular activities to be leaders and treat other students with kindness and respect. Unfortunately, bullying in-person and on social media has become a problem.

Therefore, if any student bullies, teases, or says something mean, inappropriate, disrespectful, or cruel over social media even if they only mean it as a joke or they were "just playing" he or she will not be allowed to participate in sports or extracurricular activities.
