At Home E-Learning Days
4th Grade

In the event of inclement winter weather, Pleasant Valley School District will be using E-Learning Days this year. This allows us to not make up snow days at the end of the year. This also means that it is a required day of school attendance. **Students must log in on their home device during the e-learning day and complete the assigned work. Attendance is required.** Students will not receive credit for attendance if work is not turned in on time and complete. Below is the information you will need for your child to participate in the E-Learning activities for our class.

- We will be available via Google Classroom and email at cjones@pv62.com and bdonahue@pv62.com between the hours of 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. to answer questions and offer assistance on assignments.
- Work for the day will be posted by 9 a.m.
- All assignments will be available via Google Classroom. (We use Google Classroom daily in school so your child will be able to log in.)
- Once in Google Classroom, your child will find a tab with the E-Learning date under the classwork tab.
- For each assignment, students will need to click on "view assignment" and read the provided directions.
- If your child is in Mrs. Donahue's math class, they will need to log into **her** Math Google Classroom in order to access and complete their math assignment for the day. If your child is in Mrs. Jones' math class, they will need to log into **her** Math Google Classroom in order to access and complete their math assignment for the day.
- Students will then open any attached files, slides, and/or videos and complete the required work. Students are responsible for completing all aspects of each assignment.
- Once all assignments in Google Classroom are completed and turned in, your child is finished with e-learning work for the day and will be marked as present for the day.

It is our hope that we do not need to utilize at home-learning days, but we all know how unpredictable Illinois weather is. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns.
