

E-Learning with Ms. Hall:

Dear Parents,

In case of inclement weather Pleasant Valley has decided to utilize e-Learning days as an alternative for emergency days. The term “e-Learning day” refers to a school day when instead of coming into a school building, teachers and students communicate online. Ms. Hall’s class will communicate through Google classroom and email on these days. Assignments can be turned in as a Google Doc, or students can turn in their work on paper if they prefer to use pencil and paper.

These emergency e-Learning days will be utilized if school were to be closed due to inclement weather. Parents/guardians will receive an automated phone call or text stating that an e-Learning day will be used.

- Students should NOT report to school but should engage in flexible learning activities as assigned
- I will post work by 9am for students.
- I will also be available through email from 9am - 2pm to answer questions and provide guidance.

Assignments your child can expect to see will vary on what classes they see me for (not all of my students see me for the same subjects). Therefore, they will only see the assignments that pertain to them in their Google Classroom.

Assignments they can expect to see on Google Classroom:

Math: Students can expect to find worksheets with multi-operational word problems, or equations that will align with their IEP goals. Students will be expected to work the problems out on a separate sheet of paper. They MUST show their work as well as the answers, and label the problems correctly if they are word problems. They may use a calculator to complete this work but again MUST show their work.

Reading: Students can expect to find various articles with comprehension questions attached to them. They can submit their answers through Google Docs, or on a separate piece of paper (to be turned in when school resumes). Students will also be required to complete an assigned EdPuzzel posted in Google Classroom, and answer the in story questions.

Language: They will then have a writing prompt that they can turn in, again through Google Docs, or on a piece of paper. They are to write a minimum of 5 complete

sentences. Paying attention to capitalization, punctuation, and potential run-on sentences. If they complete MORE than the minimum (5 sentences) they will receive panther bucks for exceeding the minimum when class resumes in person.

In addition to classwork to be completed for me they will be responsible for completing their work in their other classes they don't meet with me for, as well as Science and Social Studies. Those teachers will have their own expectations shared with you and your child. If you have any questions you can contact me at **shall@pv62.com** between 9am and 2pm on these days.
